### FOXLEY GROUP PARISH COUNCIL - MAY 2022

The quarterly meeting of Foxley Group Parish Council, held in May each year, comprises both the Annual Meeting and the regular General Meeting. The first item on the Annual Meeting agenda is the election of Chairman and Vice Chairman to which Cal Edwards and Dave Gwynne were elected respectively. The other main topic relates to governance of the parish council. The council is funded by public money and as such it is vital that it is transparent and accountable in how it spends this money. Each year, therefore, at the end of the financial year the council goes through an audit of the controls in place. It also reviews and publishes information about how it has managed it's financial affairs. The council therefore reviewed and approved the various documents related to this, all of which are then published on the website. The General

Meeting discussed the possibility of an additional defibrillator at Moorhampton, improvements to the visibility at the Moorhampton junction with the main A480, the Local Plan consultation and the award of over £4,000 additional council funding for drainage improvements. These funds will pay for extra maintenance of existing ditches and culverts to clear them going into the winter period. This will hopefully ensure that they serve their purpose at times of heavy rainfall and keep the roads clear of floodwater.


