The Harvest Mouse (Micromys Minutus)

Micromys Minutus translates from the Latin as "smallest tiny mouse". The harvest mouse can weigh as little as a 20p piece. They grows to between 50-70mm and apart from their small size their skeleton is also notably light, being just 5% of their total weight. Ours is 15% of our bodyweight. This beautiful tiny mouse is a russet orange in colour with undersides of pure white. They have small but furry ears and a shorter muzzle than most mice. The Harvest mouse's tail is unique being prehensile and is used as a fifth limb, normally as an emergency brake when descending head first.

These little mice more than likely came over from China before the English channel was formed. They have still not moved very far North and are not found in Scotland or Wales. Most Harvest mice are found in England below Yorkshire.

The Harvest mouse lives reedbeds, hedgerows, woodlands. Areas of tall this little mouse as this is They are omnivores and invertebrates but they roots and fungi. They are will feed in the stalk zone particularly around dusk and they will react very dropping into cover. This

Their hearing is acute quickly by either freezing or response can be to rustling 7

metres away. In Winter they are forced to cease their climbing lifestyle and descend to ground level. They are now in competition for food with other small mammals. The Harvest mouse is the only British mammal to build a nest of woven grass well above ground level, up to one metre. Their nests are built depending on their needs, a small nest of 5cm in diameter for a non breeding nest. A 10cm diameter nest for a breeding one. They will have several litters a year between May to October and most litters are born in August. Litters are normally around 3-8 pups and are born blind and hairless. These extremely tiny mice grow fast and start exploring on the 11th day. By the 16th day the young are abandoned but will continue to use the nest. The most familiar image of the Harvest mouse is in a crop of wheat or barley. Today with farming methods this would be extremely rare. The biggest threat is cold wet weather and a threat to the management of grassland. Mowing in late Summer is very bad for this little mouse due to breeding during this time, also if no scrubland is left over winter they will have no shelter. They receive no formal legal protection at this time, but are on the red list of threatened species. The picture is of the only Harvest mouse I've seen . This was with the Gloucester Wildlife Trust and the mouse was pregnant. We couldn't believe how small she was and fell in love with them immediately. Angle Starling

Feeding Birds in the Winter

It can be tough for our birds at any time in our changing climate and farming methods. But the cold of winter means they need much more energy just to keep warm. With the shorter days it also means they have less time to find their food. But if you are kind enough to help them out no matter what size garden you have, you will be helping these little guys just to stay alive



If you take a few minutes to know what birds are visiting you this can help. Different birds eat different things in different ways. Some prefer feeders and some prefer being on the ground. Some prefer nuts and fats while others fruit. A little bit of knowledge can help you help them but at the end of the day if you put some food up high and on the ground they will find it. Now leftovers. Most are great but will cover what you can leave and what to not put out. Great leftovers are cake, mince pies, dried fruit (if you can moisten it with a bit of warm water even better) unsalted nuts, fruit, grated cheese, potatoes in any form as long as it is unsalted, pastry raw or cooked, oats, cooked pasta and rice. All of this is excellent for our song birds to snack on. Bacon rind is ok again as long as it is unsalted. So the next list is a definite please do not feed to your birds. Salt is huge no as it's poisonous to them. Anything mouldy as this can spread disease and is obviously not a healthy option. No turkey fat, it's too soft and will stick to their feathers and stop the very important weatherproofing from working. No bread or milk. No desiccated coconut, fresh is ok. Remember your own pets too as vine fruit can be very bad for them so make sure they can't hoover up what you're putting down for the birds.

Obviously you can buy lots of great food all year round as well. Suet, peanuts, sunflower hearts, nyger seeds and lots of other seeds which provide fast high energy food for them. By feeding are we interfering with their natural survival? Well research suggests that food gathered at feeders makes up less than 20% of the diet of blue tits in winter. So there is no reason that they would lose their ability to to naturally forage for food.

We have already interfered with their habitat by seriously lessoning it with building. With intensive farming that leaves no edges and uses lots of pesticides, and with climate change altering how the insects and plants are behaving at different times of the year. So these little creatures who we can all help unlike other wildlife who might not visit us, definitely need all we can give them. It's also incredibly good for our emotional stability and mental health.

By helping them we help ourselves.

Remember if you use feeders please give then a good clean with hot water regularly to stop any diseases from spreading. Lastly please provide some fresh water, even a small saucer helps. Just make sure in very cold weather it's not frozen Thank you

Due to the Coronavirus outbreak the Parish Council has not met in person since September, with the next physical meeting planned for February. It is hoped that by then, the situation has improved and that meeting can go ahead. That said, any council business arising continues to be dealt with remotely. At the time of writing, the first phase of the drainage clearance project has been completed. That is to say, the main open ditches on the minor roads across the Foxley Group have been cleared of silt and vegetation. Also the grippers, the paths for water to pass through any raised verges into the ditches themselves, have also been cleared or re-cut. Phase two which involves high pressure jetting of the covered drains is due by the end of November. The water jet uses a sophisticated head that will not only unblock silt but will even cut through and remove tree roots. This work is being undertaken as a one-off exercise and is funded by a grant, obtained from the County council, over and above the standard annual precept. The intention is to ensure all roads for which the Parish council has routine maintenance responsibility, are well prepared for the Winter season. The main roads passing through the area, for example the A480, remain the responsibility of the County Council and their contractor, Balfour Beatty. Another issue that had previously arisen was that the first bus of the day toward Weobley and beyond was timetabled to bypass the village. After a prolonged series of exchanges with the County Council and the bus operator, this bus now passes through the village and is due at the church at 8.10.

After more than ten years as Parish Clerk, Brian Barrett has stepped down and Rob Hallett has taken over. Brian has done sterling work over this time to ensure the the Parish Council has run smoothly and that the Councillors have been able to reflect the views and wishes of the residents. The Parish Council thanks him sincerely for all he has done and wishes him and Caroline well in their new home in Stourport

Dear Friends,

In 1 Kings 17 in the Old Testament, God called Elijah out into the wilderness, to a place of separation. That's something that a lot of people can relate to right now as they find themselves separated from family, friends and colleagues, as we find ourselves, once again, in lock-down. God deliberately separated Elijah out for a time and for a purpose, so let's assume that God has allowed this separation for us too. In Elijah's isolation, God provided water and he used ravens to bring Elijah bread and meat. They were an unlikely and unexpected delivery service because ravens normally steal food; they don't give it away! But God is a God of surprises, and a God who sustains us in difficult circumstances. Elijah spent time alone with God for 18 months, and during that time he got to know God in a way that he'd never known him before, and to see him do things he'd never seen before. When we find ourselves locked-down away from family, friends and other people, we will see God move in ways we've never experienced before. The place of separation was also a place of shielding for Elijah because, unknown to him King Ahab was looking for him to kill him.

If you find yourself separated from those things and people you feel you really need, draw closer to God and see him surprise, shield and sustain you. Remember, **Jesus** made a promise to his followers before he left this world: he **said**, "I **am with you always**," and thanks to the work he did on the cross, these words are not small or empty. They carry great weight and understanding, for our **security in Jesus** came at unimaginable cost. And now, thanks to the sacrifice of Jesus we can rest in the assurance that we are **never alone**, because every believer is saved by the grace of God through the work of Jesus Christ.

None of us can be certain at this time what sort of Christmas we might have this year, but I hope and pray that it won't be a lonely one, that you will find company in the God who loves you and who longs to be a part of your life if you will let him.

May God bless you this Christmas Season and bring you peace.
